The turning point in our family's journey came just over a year ago when we found a family organization and gained "inspired clarity and empathy."

Too often in the process of evaluating a child, the emotional climate becomes clinical. Laws, terminology, and diagnoses become the discouraging vocabulary we parents use to find help.

After ten years of searching through therapists, specialists, educator-- anyone with an informed opinion-- we found Southern Maine Parent Awareness, which became our bridge to clarity and confidence.

Family organizations understand the frustrating and uncertain process we go through. They also recognize our children as human beings with unique gifts. And they understand the ignorance of others that our children endure daily. They get the prerequisite determination of parents advocating for their children's rights.

Our advocate has taught me the power of empathetic listening and patience... nodding quietly as I recalled our detailed struggle to find help. She reminds me to choose "partnerships" instead of "frustrated divides."

What I'm inspired by is my son's determination and success. I'm inspired by tireless family advocates who work diligently for family after family searching for what we all want for our kids. I'm inspired by all those who roll up their sleeves to figure it out.
